FLOOR SUPER-POLISH

The Village Hall's floor takes a pounding - the Hall is in constant use, 7 days a week, for all sorts of activities. The current floor was installed as part of the major refurbishment that took place in 2003. The surface is now looking a little shabby, the laquer is peeling and it's somewhat discoloured. Thankfully this type of maple floor can be treated by re-sanding, sealing and coating and this job will be done this month. The Main Hall will be closed from 6th August for a couple of weeks so that the job can be done and the coatings allowed to firm up. The work will cost around £3,000.

Because of this there won't be time for the annual spruce up and repaint - but we shall be retouching and tackling the gloss paint on inner doors, etc. If you have some time and would like to help with this please get in touch through hall@feckenham.f9.co.uk

TOO DARNED HOT!

At the time of writing there's been no rain for a couple of months and it's hot. The Square Management Committee have worked to keep the village green looking good but it is, to say the least, parched. The trees have been watered but sadly one of them, a young London Plane tree has suffered from heat exhaustion and dropped its leaves. It's quite likely to recover but we shan't know for certain until the spring. Repairs to the turf itself following gas installation works are on hold because a) there's no new turf to be had because of the heat and b) if there was turf available it would simply shrivel up and die because of the heat. The gaps will be repaired as soon as normal conditions return.

- 4 The Judges' decision shall be final, and they reserve the right to withhold any prize where there are no exhibits of sufficient merit.
- 5 All exhibits shall bear an exhibitors number.
- 6 All exhibits (except those in Classes 38, 42-49, and 73-100) will be sold by auction.
- 7 All exhibits in classes 42, 43, and 44 must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for a minimum of six months.

CASH PRIZES - Children's Classes only

The Mediterranean climate that we have experienced over the last month or more has been making life difficult for our ground staff, with large cracks and holes appearing in the outfield. The situation was summarised recently by the head groundsman for Essex, who pointed out that there had been half a millimetre of rain in the last five weeks, but 100ml of water had evaporated out of the ground. The wicket area is watered to minimise cracking but it is impossible to water the large outfield area - and of course it would not be unconscionable with Severn Trent asking for care in water use.

The worst holes and cracks are being repaired with topsoil but we need rain, something which is forecast over the last half of July. By the time that you read this, the promised thunderstorms and rain should have helped the playing surface to recover as well of course as all of our gardens!

On the playing front, the first team has had a mixed time, suffering three consecutive defeats. In a low scoring game at Stourport, Feckenham fell to a 3-run defeat, despite Tom Coulson again taking a five-wicket haul. The next match against Evesham was another defeat, the visitors making better use of the conditions. Captain Jamie Reddish top-scored with 54, with support from Tom Coulson and young Flynn Duggan, who each scored 40. The trio of losses concluded with Burghill, Tillington and Weobley comfortably reaching our under-par target of 188 in 44 overs. Jamie Griffith was our top batsman, with 71.

The losing streak was however emphatically ended with a 102-run home victory over Worcester Nomads, underpinned by fine batting performances from Danny Bloomer (90) and Josh Stacey (87). The match was unusual as it was played while Russia the England football team was defeating Sweden to reach the last four of the World Cup. The Worcester League had agreed that matches could begin early and have a lunch break of up to three hours from around 3pm, in order that players could watch the game. It was pleasing to see both England and Feckenham achieve victories that day.

The second team have had a miserable month, losing all four matches with the absence of key players being a major factor, requiring third teamers - including junior Ollie Campbell and 60+ groundsman Steve Daniels - being drafted in. The 7th July (the date of England v Sweden) as a particular problem, with only 9 players being available. The team currently sits at the foot of the table, which is extremely disappointing after being so close to winning the division last season. Bright moments included Paul Hird's 61 not-out and John Raxter's four wickets for 37 runs against Droitwich, Matt Grubb's 58 against Coombs Wood.

The third team have fared rather better, the highlight being a comprehensive 147-run victory over Pedmore (Jon Dean 78 and Richard East 67) In this match several

juniors stepped up to the senior game - Ollie Campbell and Jay Blackburn both played well and scored runs, as did Jayden Houghton who also kept wicket in his very first senior game. John Raxter again took four wickets, with 13-year old Ollie Campbell taking 3 for 6 runs. We are blessed to have such fine juniors capable of playing at this level and doing so well. Another victory followed against Himley, with opening bats Simon Mitchell and Angus Hardy both scoring in the 90s. The positive sequence ended at Coombs Wood who won comfortably, Richard East's 45 runs being the one bright spot. The team did have a match scheduled for 7th July, but in common with most other clubs at this level, were unable to field a team because of the attractions of the World Cup.

Our Junior teams go from strength to strength, the under-9s achieving the eight tournament win in a row and guaranteed to win their group and qualify for County Finals. The under-11s won a close match at Cookhill, trounced Redditch and won a close T20 cup match against Rushwick. Our youngsters are competing with and beating much larger clubs and must be congratulated, along of course with their hard-working coaches.

Through June and July, the club has run "All Stars", an ECB initiative intended to introduce 5-8 year-old boys and girls to the game. Eight 45-minute sessions have been run and the 17 youngsters certainly look to have enjoyed the experience - we are hopeful that some at least will wish to join the club and its regular Friday evening junior coaching sessions.

The club's equipment woes continue. One of our mowers gave up the ghost recently, with indications that the cause is likely to be in the clutch or gearbox areas. That sounds expensive to me and emphasises our need to continually seek new ways of raising funds.

Finally, a reminder that the annual Feckfest music festival will take place on Sunday August 26th, starting at noon, with a fine variety of music until around 10:30pm. Tickets are available online via Eventbrite (<https://www.eventbrite.co.uk/e/feckfest-2018-full-price-tickets-42314817759?aff=ebdssbdestsearch>), from the club and the village shop. This year's charity beneficiary is Midlands Air Ambulance and there will be improved facilities and plenty for children - it will be a fantastic family day out.

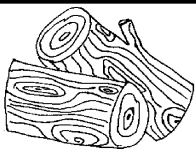

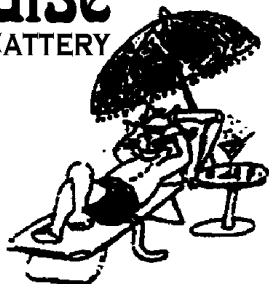
