FABSSS News Update

(Feckenham Against Battery Storage Systems and Solar)

Many thanks to all those who have submitted objections to the Redditch planning department (Paul Lester) to the Immersa BESS scheme. At the last count there were 157 objections in total (including some repetitions) but there can never be enough, so if anyone who has not yet done so, please do send in an objection. If you do not have the help info we circulated, you can find all the details you need on our website - fabsss.co.uk. This scheme is the one currently being considered by the planners at Redditch, so it is vital that we have their attention and that they know how we feel about it.

By now you should have had a survey request from the Parish Council working with the Borough Council dropping through your door. It's another part of the plan to stop these BESS (Battery Energy Storage Systems), but you must play your part and complete the form by either filling in the paper copy one or doing it electronically. Details will be on the form itself and it's very simple to complete. Answering the questions will help the Parish Council object too. Please note that it is one for each elector not one for each household, so every person needs to respond.

There are four schemes in the wind right now, but we need to tackle them one by one as they proceed through the planning process. The action group has some valuable legal and planning expertise in house and even more willing to assist us, so we are preparing to fight the applications as and when we have to. However, we may have to raise significant sums in order to do so, in due course.

Reverend Fiona writes...

I absolutely love this time of year with the shoots of spring bulbs coming up in the garden once again. It is a miracle that it happens every year, but it is always wonderful. Also, I enjoy seeing the lambs in the fields in and around Feckenham. I am really excited every year when I see my first lamb, who is normally keeping close to it's mum. I haven't seen one yet, but I am keeping my eyes open when I am out and about. They are little miracles every year and I so appreciate the work the farmers do looking after the ewes and lambs.

One of my favourite verses in the bible is Isaiah- chapter 40: verse 11 "He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those who have young". The verse is talking about Jesus. It is a prophecy as this is scripture from the Old Testament. I have always found it comforting because it says that he gently leads those with young. And because I have had four children I have always been surrounded by young children and now grandchildren. I feel I am being gently led by Jesus, and it is the same for all of us whether you are looking after children or grandchildren, Jesus is gently leading you.

Feckenham Moat - Archeology Happening This Summer

Are you interested in local history? Would you have time to help fundraise, organize and oversee archaeological investigations?

We are seeking new members for the Manorial Moated Site Group as we embark on the next chapter of investigations and research...interested?

In Feckenham, we are lucky to have two Scheduled Ancient Monuments: the churchyard cross and the former manorial moated site (also known as the football/recreation ground). The moated site in particular was placed on the At Risk register some years ago by Historic England, and through the efforts of local volunteers, has now been elevated to merely Vulnerable status. The process of doing this has taken time and effort, raising funds and engaging experts to produce a Conservation Management & Maintenance Plan, and getting a firm commitment from the landowner (Redditch BC) to carry out the necessary works on a regular basis to prevent the moat remains deteriorating further.



The site itself is a double-moat (with 2 ditches), neither of which holds water any longer except in very wet weather. You can still walk through the ditches at the lower end of the Recreation Ground, and part of the outer ditch now forms Mill Lane. The moat has Anglo Saxon origins and in Feckenham's long history, has been home to the manor buildings, court and prison – these were all located somewhere in the

centre of this site (where the football pitch and clubhouse are now).

Our group has been working to uncover and gather as much of this history as possible, as well as preserving the condition of any remains. The volunteers have raised funds and worked with archaeology groups to begin non-invasive surveys of the site; so far our Lidar and Geophysics have covered around 25% of the area. We are also seeking copies of earlier historic excavations, the detail of which is so far sadly proving elusive. These non-invasive surveys will identify where the most interesting parts of the site are/where there are traces of former buildings etc, which will inform any future work.

Our ambition for this year is to raise funds to survey as much of the remainder of the site as possible, in partnership with local archaeologists both voluntary and paid. £3,000 has already been raised so we are off to a good start but will need quite a bit more! Over the coming months we will be working to raise more funds, continue research into archives, agree the investigations and make plans for them to be carried out sometime this summer. by a further 3500 properties within Redditch. It is not yet known where the added building of houses is like to be, but Feckenham could be asked to find more land. Although much of the parish is included in the Green Belt, it is possible that this could be classified as land suitable for building. As and when we are given more information, we will share it with you.

The Parish Council met on 9th January and decided it would need a precept of £60,000 to run the Parish Council's commitments for the coming year. This will enable the council to meet its statutory obligations as well as consider awarding grants to village organisations. The grant application process has changed so please do check the guidelines before making a grant application.

The third Vehicle Activated Sign has been installed on the way into Feckenham from Droitwich. Both WCC councillors (Councillor Craig Warhurst and Councillor Mike Rouse used their divisional funds towards the cost and the Parish Council would like to thank them.

There are plans (which have been delayed) to continue works on Swansbrook Lane/ Astwood Lane to improve the flooding problems. It is hoped these works will take place in Spring/Summer 2025 and the Parish Council will contribute to these costs.

Monies have been set aside towards the costs of engaging consultants should the village decide they wish the Parish Council to object to the continued BESS planning applications. It is hoped all adults over 18 will have received a ballot form and lodged their thoughts about these BESS applications. The Parish Council thanks its Borough Councillor or colleagues for delivering 700 poll/ballot forms across the parish, even more so, as it was one of the coldest weekends. When the votes have been counted, the results will be on the Parish Council website and the new Feckenham Parish Council Facebook page.

There continues to be antisocial parking in Feckenham. Redditch Borough Council contracts parking services to visit the village and ticket offenders. Some drivers assume it is safe to park on pavements as it leaves the roads clear. Unfortunately this means anyone with a pram, pushchair, wheelchair or mobility scooter is forced to go around the parked cars and vans into the road to continue their journey. It is appreciated that Feckenham is short of parking spaces, but no one would want to be responsible for any accidents or injuries.

There will be a separate poll/ballot conducted in Astwood Bank. Cookhill Parish Council have now reached out about the best sites and have offered support to the Parish Council.

The Parish Council is due to meet again on Thursday 13th of February. All are invited to attend.

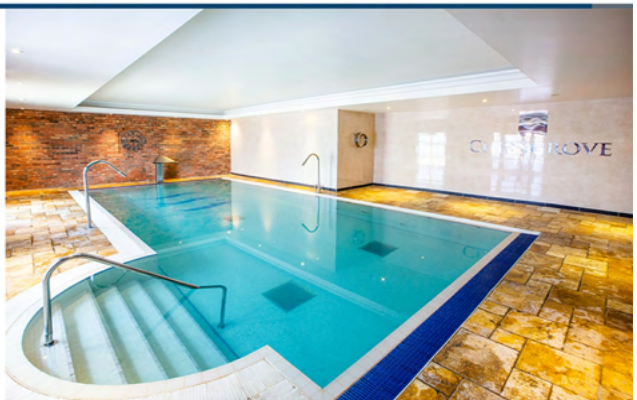

Wildlife Matters



A Rivers Trust initiative - This year's Big River Watch runs between the 25th April and the 1st May. You don't need any technical knowledge or equipment (it doesn't involve taking water samples) you just have to observe the water for 15 minutes and answer some questions on the Big River Watch app. The questions ask about such things as what plants you can see, wildlife, how the river smells, what colour it is and whether there are any barriers across it. You don't have to wait for the 25th April to send in your observations, they can be submitted at any time. The more observations submitted, the better, as The Rivers Trust can then build up a more accurate picture of the state of our waterways. There's a lot that needs to be done to improve them, as we can see from our very own Swansbrook, but more data will certainly help.

Village Shop - Alan Slater

On a recent holiday in the beautiful city of Seville, I was amazed by the profusion of orange trees. Every roadside, grass verge and square was lined with rows of trees heavily laden with oranges just waiting to be harvested. On asking the tourist guide as to what happened to the thousands of tons of fruit when it ripened, I was told that life is too bitter to eat our oranges so we send it to you in the UK. Apparently the Spanish don't like marmalade!

So January and February is our marmalade making season and the Shop has acquired a supply of Seville oranges for you to buy at £2.50 a kilo if you fancy having a go.

There is no fear that I've suddenly become a



cookery writer, I'll leave that particular skill to my more capable and famous cousin Nigel, however, one of our volunteers, Liz Teisen, has kindly provided her homemade recipe for you to try. So good luck and have some fun. Should our stock of oranges run out, don't worry as there is an endless supply in Seville and we will ship a few extra crates over. I'm sure they won't miss them.

Here is the Feckenham recipe for which I take no credit or liability,

Ingredients :- 1 kilo Seville oranges, 2-3 lemons, 2lb of sugar and 2 pints of water. This will make approximately 6 jars worth.

You will also need a jam pan or heavy bottom pan and a jam thermometer is helpful but not essential.

Method

Simmer the oranges and lemons in two pints of water until soft (approx 2 hours) then leave overnight to cool.

Sterilise the clean jam jars in the oven at 130 degrees centigrade for 15 minutes.

Slice the fruit in half and scoop the contents into a sieve. With a wooden spoon push through the juice and the mush.

Slide the fruit skin and return to the pan with the juice etc.

Add the sugar and dissolve slowly.

Finally bring to the boil and simmer until it reaches setting point at about 104 degrees centigrade which will take around 15 - 20 minutes.

Leave to cool then start bottling.

Although it's now our quietest time of the year at the Shop, trade is holding up well so thanks for your continued support.

Rob Cole's Gardening Tips

***Narcissus* 'Cedric Morris' – An Early Flowerer**

My bulbs of *Narcissus* 'Cedric Morris' flower in early December most years – the first of all my daffodils.



Sir Cedric Morris (1898-1982) was an artist, and founded the East Anglian School of Painting and Drawing at Benton End near Hadleigh, Essex. He was also an enthusiastic plant collector, plant-breeder and well-connected gardener, and he grew this tiny daffodil at Benton End for many years. It was originally collected by his occasional travelling companion, Basil Leng. Basil was a keen gardener in the South of France where he grew tree peonies and unusual bulbs.

He was driving along the north coast of Spain one cold winter's day when he spotted a clump of small daffodils on a steep bank near a railway viaduct close to the fishing village of Luarda. He stopped the car and tried to reach it by standing on the roof of his car. A girl who was passing saw what he was trying to do and, being more athletic than he was, managed to reach the daffodils.

Basil Leng's story is that when she tried to pick him a daffodil the whole clump, fifty bulbs came out, showering the car with bulbs and stones. He took the lot, and from those fifty bulbs all our stock is descended.

As far as is known, no one has found it growing near there since. From today's perspective it seems an act of quite appalling vandalism to grub out the whole clump of a rare plant, or even to take a single specimen.

Sir Cedric was friend and mentor to Beth Chatto from the 1950s until his death in 1982, and he gave her one bulb, well over forty years ago. She grew it on successfully and eventually named it for him after his death, with Basil Leng's permission. She records in her new edition of 'Woodland Garden' that she took Cedric a potful on his 90th birthday because the bulb had vanished from his own garden and shows the value of sharing your gardening treasures with your friends.

There has been quite a lot of interest shown in the last few years about *Narcissus* 'Cedric Morris' and its origin/location in the wild and the wonderfully graphic story of its capture and provenance. Although the N634 still exists in part, this has been superseded by a more modern road and previous improvements to the N634 have seen habitats and locations disappear, where once this *Narcissus* grew.

Narcissus 'Cedric Morris' is hard to find. It is tricky to micropropagate and does not bulk up well, so you will have to be patient and persistent to find it - and to keep it.

But it is out there and if you see it, buy it whilst you can.

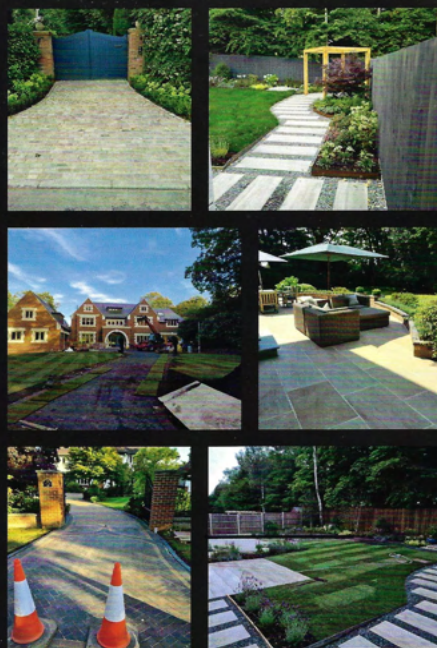
