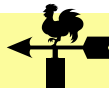

From the P.C.C.

Support for local charities....

As Christians, we look to Christ as our example. As a result, it is beholden on our church in Feckenham to hold out its hand to help those in need. As part of our strategy to help others, the PCC on behalf of our congregation, donates a proportion of Feckenham Church's income each year to charitable organisations. The charities that have been selected this year are local and consequently can have particular significance to someone living in our village.

As you may be aware, on the second Sunday of every month we have an informal lay-led service in St John the Baptist Church at 11:00am. This year, instead of simply sending our donation through the post to the selected charity, we are inviting someone living in our community, for whom that particular charity means something special, to accept our donation on behalf of the charity and to say a few words about what that charity does and why it is important to them.

On the second Sunday in January, Rosemary Wormington accepted a cheque for £600 on behalf of the charity **Brain Tumour Support** and gave us a short talk on what the charity does and why she does work for them. Rosemary gave us a very personal and insightful talk on *Brain Tumour Support*. Many of you will remember Rosemary and John's own daughter Frances, who sadly died of a brain tumour aged 10 in 2007 and who now rests in our peaceful churchyard. We were told how that when someone is diagnosed with a brain tumour the need for support can be felt at all levels of daily life, from "How will I manage financially?" to "Who will walk my dog when I'm getting treatment?". *Brain Tumour Support* are a relatively small charity but they provide

vital support to individuals and their families who are dealing with the effects of being diagnosed with a brain tumour. Rosemary, who is now Head of Support for the charity, told us that a particularly challenging aspect of some brain tumours is that the personality of the person can change, and the charity can help family and friends deal with this upsetting aspect of the disease. At the end of her talk Rosemary thanked Feckenham Church for their donation. On the second Sunday service in February, we heard from Sue Saddler and Sharon Holtom about the excellent work that the charity **Redditch Nightstop** does to prevent youth homelessness in our area. *Redditch Nightstop* works with young adults (16-25), families, schools and agencies to help people at risk of homelessness. They not only offer practical, emotional and social help, including emergency accommodation, but also provide vital support in the form of teaching life skills.

Currently, they are recruiting emergency accommodation hosts and will provide the training and support if you are interested. Following their talk, Sue and Sharon thanked Feckenham Church for donating £600 to *Redditch Nightstop*. As March is here, we are now well advanced in planning for the 2019 cricket season and we are hoping for a drier run up to April than we had last year, when several fixtures we lost due to sodden pitches.

The Worcester County League fixtures have been published and with the First Team now in the Premier Division, these were scanned eagerly to see when games against our near neighbours are scheduled.

The key dates for your diary are the visit to Mill Lane of Redditch on Saturday 18th May and of Astwood Bank two weeks later on on Saturday 1st June. The latter game in particular will be a severe test and I hope that we can give a good account of ourselves.

The first team's season starts a week earlier than previously, with a match away at Bewdley on April 13th. The early start results from the new play-off system at the end of the season, which will determine promotion to the Birmingham League. Work on the ground and its playing surfaces is beginning soon and our newly-fettled mowers and other equipment (thanks to Rob Banner) will start being used for the first time since last October. Our ground team of Steve Daniels and Neil Evans will soon find that their days will soon start to become a lot busier!

Steve himself has been with the club for more than 50 years, having joined as a schoolboy in 1963, developing as a strong batsman and wicket-keeper before becoming involved in ground maintenance and developing the skills and experience that is now used as a Pitch Adviser for the Worcester League. While still working on the ground, Steve still turns out for the third team. This incredible record of service to Feckenham Cricket Club has been recognised by the Midlands Club Cricket Conference, through the award of the Norman Sharp Trophy, which will be presented at a gala dinner at Edgbaston in early March.

The changing rooms have had minor repairs to changing room showers while the rooms themselves have been re-carpeted and repainted. Inside the clubhouse an ECB grant has enabled an electronic point of sales system to replace the elderly till. On the electronic front, first-team captain Jamie Reddish has produced a fine new

website, which will become the source of all news about the club, including a video of the club, focusing on our juniors. If you are interested, go to <https://www.feckenhamcc.co.uk/>.

Preparation for the new season will include repainting of the club's historic score-box, which will also need to be provided with power for laptop-based scoring which is a condition for clubs in the new Premier Division. Wi-fi is also needed but fortunately tests of the clubhouse facility has proven that it reaches the score-box. Other consequence of playing in the Premier Division include a need for new boundary ropes/flags and (for the 2020 season) double-sized sight screens, that enable a bowling switch without the delay of moving the current screens.

Over the next month or so, the 70+ boundary boards will be repaired where needed and then repainted, an annual event that smartens the field on match days.

Which itself reinforces the need for the club to constantly look for income sources and the early part of the year has included prospecting for banner advertising for local businesses. It is pleasing that the Village Shop has been able to support the club in this way.

August Bank Holiday may seem a long way in the distance but there has been a great deal of work already in preparation of Feckfest 2019, which this year takes place on Sunday August 25th. A number of artists have approached the club and myself and others have been to see a number of c and dates.

At the time of writing this in mid-February the musical side is nearly complete and will definitely continue our objective of increasing the quality while providing a family-friendly range of musical styles. More will be revealed in future issues.

As always, the club is keen to attract new players at all levels, particularly as the first team will be playing in the new Premier Division of the Worcestershire County League. **IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO PLAY, PLEASE CONTACT NICK REDDISH ON 07802 212125.** We also need a scorer so again please call Nick if you are interested – no experience is needed and you can also take advantage of the wonderful cricket teas that Carly creates for us.
