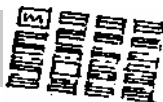

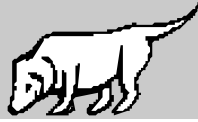

# Thought for the month

*Sally Morris*

As I write this, a number of people from our Group of Parishes are preparing to travel to Tanzania. They are visiting parts of the diocese of Morogoru, with which Worcester diocese is twinned. Having been to the area myself in 2010, I know that the trip will be challenging, exciting, inspiring and educational. In the course of my stay, I visited a secondary school. I introduced myself to the students as a secondary school teacher and offered to tell them about my school in England. A student raised his hand straight away and asked in perfect, almost accentless English 'But how would that help me pass my exams?'

This was my first striking encounter with the powerful focus, drive and ambition of these students. They were already the elite, amongst the few young people who stay in education beyond the primary stage. (Secondary education is only available to those who can pay the fees) It was crystal clear to them that their education gave them choices in life that the majority of their peers did not have. They all wanted to be doctors, engineers, lawyers – well qualified professionals. And the majority of them wanted to do it abroad.

Of course the teacher in me is delighted to see these young people value education, but I also found it quite sad that they saw education as a route out of their own country. Education was valued as a means to an end. The founding president of Tanzania, Julius Nyerere, a pioneer of adult education programmes, said 'Education is something that all of us should continue to acquire from the time we are born until the time we die.'

Education is important because it takes us somewhere, but unless we want to stop journeying, we should not stop finding ways to continue our education. During March and April we have been running a Lent course which has helped us to continue to learn about prayer, miracles and heaven. This experience falls within a very generous definition of the word

education - a definition that encompasses refreshing our own ideas, being challenged by the ideas of others and articulating the 'what and why' of the mental constructs we have in the company of friends. It was a form of education that gave something valuable to the person that told me that their experience of Holy Week had been dramatically more positive this year, because they felt they had grown and journeyed on in their faith. We don't need to wait until next Lent to educate ourselves in our faith and share that experience: we can read and talk to friends, question others and follow up ideas that inspire at any time of year. And because we can, perhaps we should. I think Nyerere deserves the last word: 'To live is to learn: and to learn is to try to live better.'

## Do you remember milk shakes?

By the time you will be reading this, we will have had it for about three weeks – long enough to learn how to use it. It means we can serve both milk shakes and fruit smoothies. Why not come and try them. Milk shakes will initially be in three flavours, strawberry, banana and chocolate. And for May, will be at a special introductory price of £1.25 for a small one and £1.75 for a large one.

**The return of the cream tea** - scone, clotted cream and jam (as last year) for just £1.99. Quite amazing value, so come on down on one of those warm May afternoons and treat yourself.

As announced last month, we can confirm the shop will be **open extended hours during the Garden Festival**. Times on Saturday are 9 to 5 and extended hours on Sunday of 10 to 4. We will be serving strawberries and cream and Pimms as specials treats.

The recent analysis of an average shopping basket, that we featured in an earlier magazine (and can now be found on the website [www.feckenhamshop.co.uk](http://www.feckenhamshop.co.uk)) didn't include a selection of **organic vegetables**. 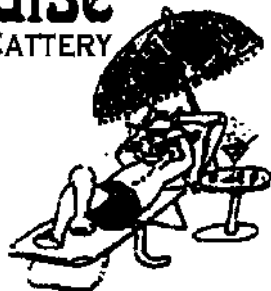
