Cllr Bellion was elected to chair the meeting. All in favour.

- **1. APOLOGIES**: Cllr Paul Downes, Cllr Alan Smith (accepted reason), and Cllr Brandon Clayton (RBC).
- 2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AND DISPENSATIONS: None.
- a) To receive declarations of interest from councillors on items on the agenda.

Localism Act 2011) which are to be with the clerk as soon as possible prior to a meeting.

Requests for dispensation must be made on an individual basis.

- **3. MINUTES:** To consider the approval of the Minutes of the meeting held Thursday 9th October 25. Agreed as a true representation of the meeting. All in favour.
- **4. COUNTY COUNCILLORS REPORT.** Cllr Bennett advised the WCC had met and formally adopted to have one Unitary Council rather than a north south divide. This will be presented to Audit and Governance (WCC) on the 18/11/25, then sent to Cabinet and then on to Government for their final decision. The Government decision will be announced in Spring 2027. It was felt there was insufficient information on these changes made decisions more difficult.

Cllr Bennett is aware of a vandalised VAS sign in Astwood Bank. He has also, (following a recent PACT meeting with the police) visited local companies following complaints received about speeding commercial traffic.

Cllr Bennett enquired if there were any updates about Moors Lane. The PC said they had given a grant of £5,000 and Cllr Warhurst advised the WCC Cllrs had given £3,000 towards improving the surface but no works have been undertaken.

Cllr Bennett remind the parish council the WCC Councillors were in possession of monies which could be used towards costs of flood works.

Cllr Eacock has been in contact with Worcestershire on demand bus service urging them to include Feckenham. Cllr Eacock is also following up Healthy Worcestershire sessions in Feckenham.

5. BOROUGH COUNCILLORS REPORT. Cllr Warhurst said the information regarding local government reorganisation was provided just before Christmas 2024 with a return date of Jan

2025 which gave little time for all considerations. Redditch felt two Unitary Councils would be their preferred choice. Cllr Hoyz reported there was still no added information about any changes to parish councils under Unitary Authorities. Cllr Hoyz reported the locations of potential building had not been released as yet but it was understood the call for land had not yielded high results. It is likely the projects will be 79% Webheath, 15% Astwood Bank and 3% Feckenham. Neither the figures nor locations have been confirmed.

Cllr Warhurst said he had raised a formal complaint to the CEO at the Borough Council about the length of time involved in planning decisions in Feckenham, Astwood Bank and outlying areas.

9. NEW AGENDA ITEMS

- a. Parish flood works and costs. The PC were concerned following the last flood meeting that the funding may no longer be available. Cllr Warhurst was unaware of this change and requested along with the WCC Councillors to organise another meeting to discuss further. The PC were led to believe the funding had been available, but the Environment Agency have said it is unlikely they can fund. It was agreed the earlier works including the culvert on Swansbrook Lane had helped the flooding, but more work was needed. This may affect the parish council precept demand.
- b. **Initial Precept discussion.** It was agreed to defer the discussions until the next meeting. All in favour.
- c. To agree amounts of reserves to deposit into higher interest accounts and select provider. The PC chose to transfer monies to another financial institution which could pay increased interest. The PC chose to have a 45-day notice account with Hinckley and Rugby Building society.
- d. **To discuss Feckenham in Bloom Terms of Reference**. The terms of referenced were agreed and all in favour.
- e. VCS applications open for Main Grants pot: FIB or another village organisation. VCS applications open for Main Grants pot It was agreed Feckenham in Bloom would apply for a grant to help with installing water tap near to the village square for watering purposes. The PC will approach The Square Management Committee before accepting a grant (if it is successful) to ensure all parties are satisfied with arrangements. All in agreement.

- g. To agree / not agree on appointing Ruth Mullett as internal auditor for 2025-2026 accounts. It was agreed to ask Ruth to continue as the IA for Feckenham. All in favour.
- h. **ELANCITY-UK Warranty Extension UK1045.** The PC agreed not to take on the warranties for the VAS machines due to the prohibitive costs. Money will be set aside in the budget to pay for repairs.

- c. **Housing Needs Survey**. Surveys have been received in the village and the PC understands Community First are starting to receive completed forms. The survey was a pre-cautionary measure to ask the parish where they would be happy to see developments and an idea on the type of homes. A third party is conducting it to avoid any perceived bias. A complaint had been received from a parishioner regarding the security of the survey. The complainant was concerned that there was potential for duplicate entries and for entries from outside the Parish. It was agreed by all to write to the Parishioner to explain the process and the precautions which had been taken.

Public Forum
