

Friends of Feckenham Parish Church

As some villagers may be aware, the roof on our historic Parish Church has to be renewed and, together with a number of other necessary works, this means the Parish has to raise a total figure in the region of £750,000, in a number of stages, over the next few years.

Replacement of the roof is the first stage. As the fundraising arm of the PCC, 'Friends' are now engaged in this major project. We are hopeful that the major part of this can be sourced from various grant funding bodies, principally from the Lottery Heritage Fund. However, we still have to raise a significant proportion ourselves. The Church is a central and important feature of our community from many perspectives, not just the religious, and we very much appreciate the support and assistance given by many local residents.

We should like to express our gratitude to Shirley Harman for her coffee morning in June which raised a most impressive £850 and to Clare Furey for the excellent Fields of Gold concert in October from which we were delighted to receive a donation of over £600 from the proceeds.

We also held a huge Sale of vintage and pre-loved Christmas decorations and collectables on the 8th November which was a great success. Our thanks go to Roger and Felicity Burman whose inspiration it was and who generously donated a huge quantity of wonderful



decorations collected over many years. In addition, Felicity also kindly made and donated over 100 festive mince pies! Thanks also to our helpers on the day and to our other kind friends who donated many desirable decorations and collectables. People attended from all over the county and the event raised over £1.200 towards our roof fund.

HOUSING NEEDS

By the time this magazine reaches you the deadline for responses to the Council's Housing Needs Survey will have passed. The survey is being carried out on the Council's behalf by Community First who will now analyse the data and present a report to the Council. The Council hopes that this will provide

The Council hopes that this will provide information that can be used to inform decisions which will have to be made in response to the government's house building targets.

CALL FOR SITES

At the meeting on 13th November it was revealed that, in response to Redditch Borough Council's "call for sites": 3% of the proposals came from Feckenham, 15% from Astwood Bank and 79% from the Callow Hill area. The exact locations of these sites have not yet been disclosed.

FLOOD PREVENTION

Discussions are ongoing with North Worcestershire Water Management, Worcestershire County Council, Environment Agency, County and Borough Councillors about the much needed flood prevention works. Following the withdrawal of some funding it is likely that the Parish Council will need to contribute more to the flood works than originally thought. The Council expects to have more detail in December.

COUNCIL FINANCES

Preliminary discussions about the the precept to be levied next year are now taking place. The precept is the amount you pay through your Council Tax bill which goes towards the running of the Parish Council. The Council faces increased and more complex challenges and costs related to these have risen. Matters are further complicated by the lack of clarity regarding the roles Parish Councils are likely to be asked to take on

following the upcoming local government reorganisation. The level of the precept will be decided in January.

LOCAL TRANSPORT

County Councillor Sue Eacock reported that the Worcestershire On Demand bus scheme is likely to be extended to Feckenham sometime in the New Year. The scheme, similar to Redditch's Dial-a - Ride scheme, is designed to help people to make essential local journeys. The new service would include journeys to Droitwich and Worcester while the Dial-a-Ride scheme would continue to cover journeys within Redditch Borough only. More information will be available soon.

BROADBAND REMINDER

As reported in last month's Feckenham News, residents are encouraged to express their interest in an improved Internet service for Feckenham. Project Gigabit exists to help poorly served areas get access to new higher speed services - but it can only do this if there is sufficient interest. You can register your interest by going to www.openreach.com/broadband-network/fibre-availability



An Organic Allotment by Pete Delaney

So here we are at the last moon of the year, from the new moon on 20th November to the new moon on 20th December, with the following day being not only the first day of the next moon phase, but the first day also of the natural new year as the calendar passes through the shortest day and all of nature stirs to welcome in the coming year.

During November I plant out garlic for next year, during December then they spring up green shoots.



My pumpkin store has served me well, I cure them in a chest with a sheet of glass for a lid as squashes need light to cure for storing. I grew traditional orange and grey Jamaican pumpkin, the latter having a nice thick flesh. My butternut squash turned out small but sweet when cooked.

Also growing green on my plot are a bed of Romaine lettuce. I left one plant from

summer crops to go to seed this autumn, I then neglected to collect the seeds, but as luck would have it several lettuce sprang up where the seed had fallen. I transplanted them into a freshly compost fed bed and built a cold frame around them to protect them from winter frosts.

This year I have had a good crop of sprouts, I removed all of the lower leaves to protect them from disease and pests. I cut the leafy heads from the plants and ate them in stir fry. Sprouts, I either cook up or slice them raw into salads.

Parsnips are looking healthy, tops showing above the soil. I leave them until the end of the month and eat the first as a festive treat on midwinters day.

Although my tomatoes finished last month, I have to mention the abundant crop this year. Harvesting from early July until mid November. I stop watering near the end to panic ripen them.

Of course at this time of the year I continue to add greenery and veggie peelings to my compost heaps to make feed, throwing in chicken and horse muck to create a compost of multi nutrients with which to feed the plots beds during the winter months.

Rob Cole's Gardening Tips

More Early Winter Berries and Fruits



Nicandra physalodes (left) is an annual, grown for its prolific soft blue flowers emerging from almost black calyces. When the flowers are over and the fruits begin to swell the whole plant takes on a different and sinister look. It sets copious seed and unless it is deadheaded ruthlessly it can become a bit of a weed, but enjoy the colour for a while.



Our best fruiting trees were both crab apples. The first was a tree which we bought in memory of my Mum, who died in 2004. As we arrived at Golls Nursery, near Evesham, we could see a wonderful fruiting tree overhanging the fence to the car park. We both said "That's gorgeous" and headed off to see what it was. The label read *Malus* x *atrosanguinea* 'Gorgeous' and we knew it was destined to be ours.

The other is *Malus* 'Evereste' which we bought in 2017. It grew well, and three years later when we left Meadow Farm, we decided that it was a tree that would be suitable in our new and much smaller garden in Salford Priors and was the first thing we planted. The flowers are typical apple blossom white and pink, and the fruit is a good red orange. And they last well (right).



Just a few things to finish with now. *Chaenomeles* varieties reward us with fruits regularly and reliably, and I have raised many seedlings from the 'apple pip' seeds within. They look as good when they fall to the ground (left).







Magnolia is not a subject renowned for its fruiting prowess, but in some years they do fruit quite noticeably, as in this Magnolia x loebneri 'Merrill' (left centre) which I photographed in late October 2013. In the cruel winter of 2010/11 the fruit of Viburnum opulus showed up splendidly amongst the hoar frosted branches (right centre) and, whatever the weather, we found that the fruits were always the last to be taken by the birds. And finally, the seedpods of Wisteria (right) last well into the new year before falling and splitting to reveal the disc-like seeds inside.

So when deciding what to do to make your garden more interesting in the early winter, remember to make more use of these fine and readily available plants.
